
Timeline

The Private Healthcare Facilities Ordinance (PHFO)

The PHFO was gazetted on 30 November 2018

- A new regulatory regime to further protect patient safety and rights
- All private healthcare facilities where registered medical practitioners and/or registered dentists practise must obtain a licence or a letter of exemption







Private healthcare facilities (PHFs) to be regulated

- Four types of PHFs are subject to regulation
- The PHFO is being implemented in phases based on the types of PHFs and their risk levels





Classification of hospital, DPC and clinic

	Hospital	DPC	Clinic*
Provide medical services to patients with lodging	✓	×	×
Provide medical procedures which require continuous confinement of the patient within the facility for more than 12 hours	√	×	×
Receive pregnant women for childbirth or women immediately after childbirth	✓	×	×
Provide hospital-only medical procedures stipulated in the Code of Practice for Day Procedure Centres	√	×	×
Provide scheduled medical procedures specified in Column 2 of Schedule 3 to the PHFO	✓	√	×
Provide consultation services and minor medical procedures specified in section 2, and Column 3 of Schedule 3 to the PHFO	✓	✓	✓

Meaning of clinic



Premises where registered medical practitioners or registered dentists provide medical services without lodging



NOT to provide
services to pregnant
women for childbirth or
women immediately
after childbirth



Continuous confinement of patients within the clinic should not exceed 12 hours

scheduled medical procedures or hospital-only medical procedures

Cannot provide the scheduled medical procedures specified in the PHFO or the hospital-only medical procedures stipulated in the Code of Practice for Day Procedure Centres



Meaning of small practice clinic (SPC)

- Clinics operated only by registered medical practitioner(s) or registered dentist(s)
- The operation may be in the form of a sole proprietorship, a partnership or a company
- The following three necessary conditions must also be met:

1. Number of doctors or dentists

2. The exclusive right of operators to use the premises

3. Locum arrangements



 - (ii) When the first batch of clinic licences take effect (date to be confirmed), the **Medical Clinics Ordinance (Cap. 343)** will be repealed
